# **Checklist for Facility-Hosted Vaccine Clinic**

A facility-hosted vaccine clinic for residents, staff, and the community can support your community vaccination rates and protect your residents from potential exposure to vaccine-preventable disease, promoting the need for a joint effort with the community. This toolkit walks you through the steps of partnering with your local pharmacy and/or local DOH to offer a vaccine clinic.

# **Pre-planning**

# Identify the vaccine provider.

You can partner with your local health department, pharmacies, a health system, or other medical providers. Visit <u>Vaccines</u>. gov to find a vaccine provider near you.

# Discuss your facility-hosted vaccination clinic and identify roles and responsibilities with:

- · Facility leadership team
- Pharmacy partner
- Local State/County Department of Health
- Local Emergency Preparedness agency
- Emergency Medical Services
- Local Health Systems (example local hospital)

#### Pick a date and location:

Can you offer the clinic outside in the parking lot? Do you have an available space within your building?

#### Items to consider:

- Will you limit participation to certain groups?
- Will you limit participation by age?
- Will you offer more than one vaccine?
- How will you refer people if you cannot provide a certain vaccine (try not to lose momentum if someone presents to your clinic.)
